SSA Guided Implentation Training

This month, the Service and Support Administrator (SSA) Department participated in a Guided Implementation series presented by Barb Sapharas from the Family Resource Network of Ohio. This eight-session series provided an overview of Charting the Life Course and Person-Centered Thinking. It delved into how the principles, tools, and skills are integrated into practice and offered guided exercises on using 13 different tools and principles. The goal of the training was to better understand how to empower individuals and families to plan for their futures and take charge of their lives.

Since completing the training, the SSAs have utilized these tools to help medical professionals understand the needs of individuals who are apprehensive about treatment, assist people in identifying the supports available to them when they believed they had none, and aid families and aging caregivers in completing future needs, planning, and more.

SSA Director Natasha Nichols states, "The more tools we have to support people, the better we can provide services. We are grateful to Barb and the Family Resource Network of Ohio for allowing us to continue our growth and for helping us identify how we can build upon this foundation of skills for years to come."
