Requirements:

- Associate's degree or equivalent level of postsecondary education/training in Education, Behavioral Support, Special Education, or related field.
- Knowledge or experience with Behavioral Support Strategies, Child Development and/or current trend of education for children with intensive disabilities and behaviors.
- One year of experience working with students with Intensive Special Needs in a school setting.
- Experience or training on how to safely move or restrain individuals or objects.
- Basic Sign language or experience working with non-verbal students using a total communication approach.
- Training in Autism
- State of Ohio Department of Educational Aide Certificate with ESEA qualified endorsement
- State of Ohio passenger vehicle drivers' license and valid vehicle insurance.
- Must pass physical ability exam, drug screen, and background checks.

Responsibilities:

- Use appropriate methods, materials, and equipment, adjusting and scaffolding learning activities, as needed. Develop and implement specific behavior interventions and therapeutic supports. Provide classroom support by filling in for classroom personnel and/or assisting to provide support for intensive behaviors as assigned by supervisor. Assist students with mobility, physical and clothing needs, behavior support strategies, positioning, feeding, toileting, basic therapeutic exercises, medical procedures, etc. under direction of designated specialist. Coordinate programs with various specialists. Complete specialized medical procedures as needed. Provide opportunities for community-based and in-school job training. Assist in transitioning students from school to work environments.
- Assist in developing IEPs. Conduct debriefing reports with teams following UI's. Collaborate with Resource and Support Coordinator to follow DODD and human rights guidelines. Assist in creating daily plans and activities designed to address IEP goals, incorporate specialized curricular needs, and improve student skills in communication, academics, functional living, vocational abilities, self-care, leisure pursuits, and community access. Evaluate/assess and document student performance to assist the Intervention Specialist with the writing of IEP progress reports, ETR reports and other special reports.
